

SMBA Adopt-a-Trail Program 2022

The SMBA Adopt-A-Trail program is being slimmed down in 2022. We hope to recruit more trail adopters by reducing the burden that trail adoption entails. We have found that the program is most important in the spring when trails need to be prepped for the season. This year, the Adopt-A-Trail program will focus on ensuring that trails are in good shape at the start of the season, rather than requiring weekly inspections for the entire season.

Requirements/Expectations

- Brush out your trail at the start of the season. The SMBA has brush saws and any other tool you would need.
- Assess your trail for any maintenance issues that need to be fixed. You may either fix the issue yourself or report it via the Slack communication platform. Maintenance should be performed according to the SMBA and RSTBC Trail Standards.
- Participants will be required to take a 1-day Chainsaw Safety Course if they are going to be operating a chainsaw (this course will be paid and organized by the SMBA)
- A trail inspection report will need to be completed once the trail has been prepped for the season. This is to satisfy our Partnership Agreement with RSTBC. The inspection is completed by filling in a form.

Notes

The SMBA uses Slack as a communication hub for organizing trail work. Volunteers will be sent a link that allows them join the Slack page.
